### **Planning Commission Updates**

The Planning Commission considered the following cases on Monday, May 1, 2017:

• AP2016.17-25 150 Jeffords – The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing to consider an Application for Planned Unit Development (PUD) and Area Plan for 150 Jeffords. The application was submitted by Guenther Building Company and Joseph Schulz, Schulz Development II, LLC, on behalf of Mill Creek Terrace LLC. The applicants are proposing a 4-story, 20-22 unit owner-occupied residential development to be located at 150 Jeffords, across the street from Mill Creek Park, and one block south of the intersection of Alpine and Main Street, in downtown Dexter.

Following presentations by the Planning and Engineering Consultants (CWA and OHM, respectively), City Staff and the applicant, Chairman Kowalski opened the public hearing. No public comments were offered.

Following the public hearing, and after a thorough discussion the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the proposed Application for PUD and Area Plan for 150 Jeffords, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Staff review dated May 1, 2017;
- (2) CWA review dated, April 19, 2107;
- (3) OHM review dated, April 19, 2017;
- (4) DAFD review dated, April 8, 2017;
- (5) The applicant must submit an amendment to the Mill Creek Terrace Development Agreement for review and approval of city staff, the DDA, and the City Attorney, prior to City Council consideration of the Area Plan; and
- (6) The following recommendations/determinations:
  - a. The proposed mixed-use development, with retail or office on the first floor and residential dwelling units on the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> floors, complies with the Master Plan.
  - b. The proposed density, 22 residential dwelling units, is recommended.
  - c. The request for a deviation from the 70% glass requirement in Section 15(A).04C is recommended.
  - d. The proposed property swap is recommended.
  - e. The proposed building height is recommended.
  - f. Twenty-four under building (on-site) parking spaces is recommended; and
  - g. The proposed \$2,500/parking space contribution to the City's Parking Fund, for 24 parking spaces, is recommended as a recognized and material benefit.

- The Planning Commission conducted a public hearing to consider amendments to the Zoning Ordinance.
  - Article I, Enacting Clause, Title, Purpose
  - Article IV, Non-Conformities
  - Article VIII, Special Land Uses
  - Article XIX, Planned Unit Development (PUD)
  - Article XXI, Site Plan Review
  - Article XXII, Administration and Enforcement
  - Article XXIII, Ordinance Amendments
  - Article XXIV, Zoning Board of Appeals

There were no public comments offered. After the public hearing, the Planning Commission voted 5-2 to postpone action until its June 5<sup>th</sup> meeting.

• The Planning Commission considered a Combined Site Plan for a 29,371 sq. ft. addition to the existing 52,149 sq. ft. Variety Die and Stamping facility, located at 2221 Bishop Circle West. It's been two years since the company's last expansion.

The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend conditional <u>Preliminary Site Plan</u> approval to City Council. The reason for the recommendation for <u>preliminary</u> approval rather than <u>final</u> approval was due to 1) the applicant's last minute request for landscape modifications, and 2) the site plan did not have sufficient detail to evaluate the applicant's request. The recommendation for approval is subject to the following conditions:

- Staff review dated, May 1, 2017
- CWA review dated, April 20, 2017
- OHM review dated, April 19, 2017
- DAFD review dated, April 8, 2017 and
- The applicant must submit a revised landscape plan.
- The Zoning Board of Appeals is scheduled to conduct a public hearing on Monday, May 15, 2017. The purpose of the hearing is to consider a variance request, submitted by 814 Development, on behalf of Rainbow Rascals MI Dexter LLC, for a portion of vacant property located at the intersection of Dexter Ann Arbor Road and Eaton Court (portion of parcel 08-08-05-300-061). The applicant has requested a variance from Section 15(B).02.C.1, of the City of Dexter Zoning Ordinance, which requires new building setbacks to be uniform with adjacent lots in the PB Professional Business Districts.

<u>Backstory:</u> On May 1, 2017 the Planning Commission considered a Combined Site Plan for a child care center that showed the structure having a front yard setback of 86.89 feet, which was not uniform with an existing structure, on the lot adjacent to the southeast of the subject site. The front yard setback of said adjacent structure is 39.86 feet. The Commission expressed concern that plan did not provide a "uniform front building setback" with the bank on the adjacent property, in accordance with the ARC Dexter Ann Arbor Corridor Overlay District (Section 15(B).02.C.1). The Planning Commission postponed action on the combined site plan for Rainbow Child Care Center to allow the applicant time to address the setback issue.

Following the May 1st Planning Commission meeting, the applicant has submitted a revise the plan that provides a more "uniform front building setback". Consequently, the applicant has asked and staff recommends the public hearing to consider the variance request must be postponed,

until the Planning Commission has a chance to review the revised plan, and determine if it complies with Section 15(B).02.C.1.

Written questions regarding the Requests for Proposals an Economic Development Strategy were
